## **Reflection for Corpus Christi**

Today we honour and adore the "Body and Blood of Our Lord Jesus Christ", broken and given for the salvation of all, made food to support our "life in the Spirit" - it is the feast of the Eucharist. The real presence of Christ, the Eucharist recalls directly the memory of the Incarnation, which constitutes the central and supporting core of its own reality.

With the mystery of the Incarnation, man is as "deified". Christ ensures, over time, this delicate and special identity to man, in the "bread" established, to nourish him spiritually over time.

The Eucharist, therefore, forms the very basis, the "source and summit", of the Church and Christian life, which thus becomes the "historical continuation of the Incarnation", with the specific task of administering all the goods of Redemption, offered freely by Christ himself, and delivered especially in the sacramental substance.

Jesus multiplied the loaves and fishes to feed the crowd that followed him: real food works and nourishes me, providing energy and growth, even when I am unaware of it, even when asleep it turns into flesh, blood and vital energy. Spiritual food, however, is different: it is effective if I collaborate with Christ, who wants to transform my life into his.

The Eucharist is the feast of faith, it stimulates and strengthens faith. Our relationships with God are shrouded in mystery: it takes great courage and great faith to say: "Here is the Lord!" If I look at myself, I always find myself small, imperfect, a sinner, full of limits. Yet God loves me, as he loves all persons, to the point of becoming our food and drink to communicate his divine life to us, to make us live his life of love.

The Eucharist is not credible if it remains just ritual, the memory recalled two thousand years ago. Instead, it is a "school of life", a proposal of love that involves my whole life: it must make me available to love my neighbour, to the point of giving my life for others according to the example that Jesus left us.
