#### Reflection

The subject of the divine vocation is revealed here with the familiar scriptural expression from Jesus "The harvest is rich but the labourers are few. Pray the master of the harvest, to send out labourers to his harvest." According to some scholars, the reference to the harvest alludes to the times of judgment, the time in which God will come as a judge to "sift the grain" by assigning some to life and others to eternal damnation. The harvest, therefore, indicates in this sense the future salvation.

By extension, we can say that workers are needed who will prepare the grapes to mature - that lead the people of God to become meritorious of salvation. Prophets, preachers, missionaries, priests and others consecrated to the ministry are especially called to be dispensers of grace and heralds of the Kingdom of God so that all may be saved, these are the workers who serve and for whom it is necessary to pray to God the Lord of the harvest.

The Lord has entrusted this mission to his church. It is not reserved strictly for those in its bosom who hold a hierarchical ministry (which is still that of service): all believers and loved, are called; and as such they have a task to do, clothed by the Holy Spirit with the gifts properly allotted, necessary to carry it out.

The mission in which Jesus chooses seventy-two disciples would be enough to conclude that the church is a pilgrim people; a people 'sent' out. The church is missionary, by its very nature a mission! There are numerous magisterial documents that confirm this truth. In fact, there is much more that the church must do in her children and in her structures to evangelise, to convince and to convert. The effort of Pope Francis in his exhortation in Evangelii Gaudium amply demonstrates this; it needs to be embraced as the pastoral choice of a large part of the church.

Pray(Lk 10: 2): mission is greater than our existence, it is beyond our capacity to understand it. The mission springs from the Father, and it is therefore to the Father that we must always turn, not to feel indispensable but to live well, in faith, the "gap" that will always be felt between what we do and what is needed. The mission therefore arises from prayer and in prayer it will bear fruit.
